Open Access policy, Center for Neuroplasticity and Pain (CNAP)

The Open Access policy of the Danish National Research Foundation (DNRF) applies to DNRF grant holders. With the policy, DNRF wants to establish Open Access as the standard in scientific publishing. The aim is to ensure that all scientific articles, the quality of which has been assured by peer review and which have been published in a scientific journal, can be read and distributed without any financial, technical or legal restrictions. The policy means that published scientific articles which are the result of full or part financing by DNRF must be made freely available to everybody via Open Access with the permission of the journal. To meet the recommendation of DNRF to publish open access, CNAP must "parallel publish" your journal article as *green open access*, i.e. upload the *accepted manuscript* in the institutional repository of Aalborg University, which is VBN.

The *accepted manuscript* (also called the post-print version) is the author's final version and the one sent to the journal after all changes suggested by the peer reviewers have been made and incorporated, but still without the logotype and columns of the journal. In many cases, images, charts, tables and other illustrations will be arranged differently from the publisher's final version. The accepted version can also have the rows numbered. The content of this version is the same as in the publisher's final version, but the layout will be different.

The CNAP author must make the *accepted manuscript* appear as neat and readable as possible, and then save it as a pdf and e-mail it to Pia Lund (plund@hst.aau.dk) whereupon Anne Lyhne Høj vbn-hst@aub.aau.dk will upload it in VBN, securing that it will not be visible until a demanded embargo period has passed.
